As Jesus and his disciples approached Jerusalem, they came to the towns of Bethphage and Bethany on the Mount of Olives. Jesus sent two of them ahead saying, "Go to that village over there. As soon as you enter it, you will see a young donkey tied there that no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their garments over it, and he sat on it. As he entered Jerusalem, many in the crowd spread their garments on the road ahead of him, and others waved palm branches they had cut in the fields. Jesus was in the center of the procession, and the people all around him were shouting...
